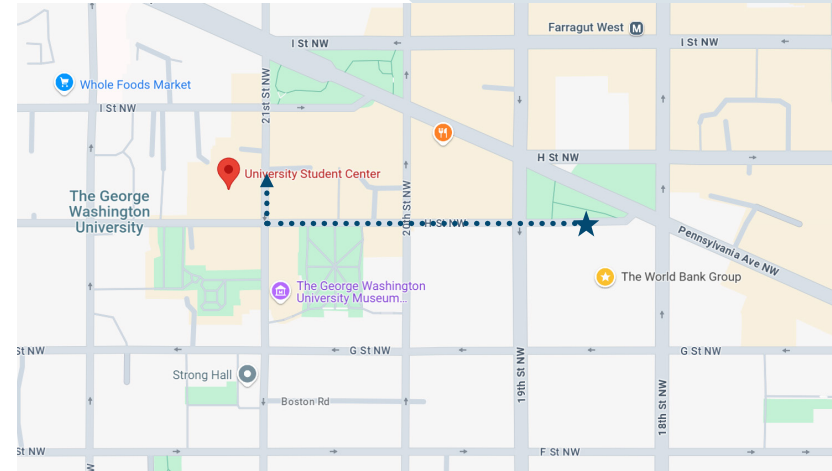
# GENERAL INFORMATION

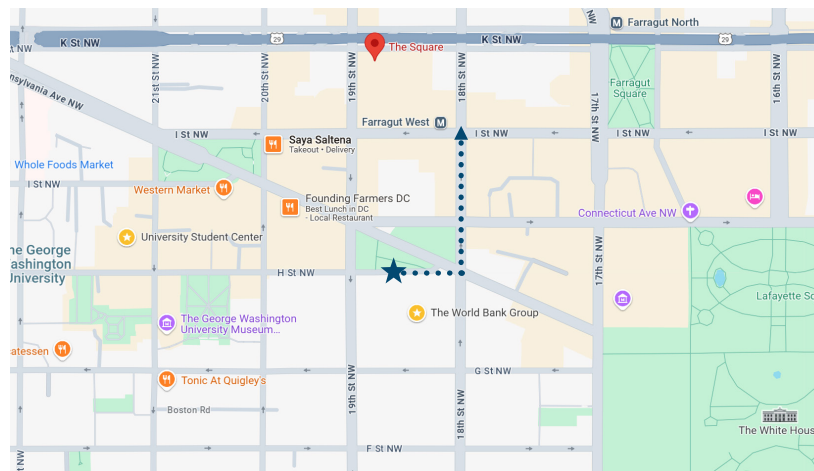

**Abstract:** The Poverty and Inequality Platform (PIP) hosts data for 172 countries covering more than 97% of the global population. PIP directly uses survey micro data for 156 countries (73% of the global population) and supplements these with grouped and binned income or consumption data for other countries. This session will introduce PIP and show how to access the poverty and inequality estimates using the PIP API through Stata or R. The session will also show how users can work with microdata directly for select countries and where to access percentile level data for all surveys in PIP. Finally, We encourage you to bring your laptops to the session for hands on learning, but it is not necessary. For Stata users, you will need Stata 16 or higher.
